

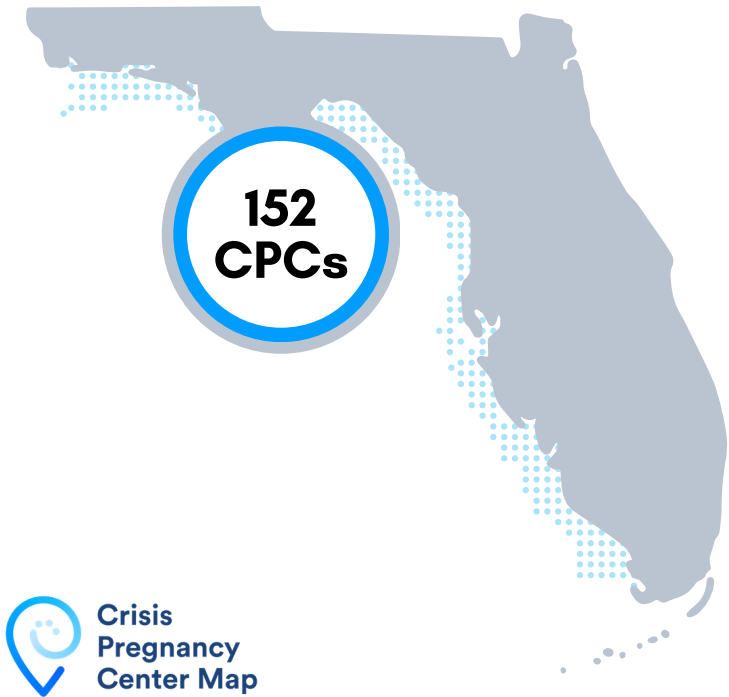

**Crisis pregnancy centers (CPCs) are religious non-profit organizations that aim to divert people from having abortions.** CPCs also oppose contraception and comprehensive sex education. Although the centers offer some limited health services, they are not medical clinics, frequently provide inaccurate health information, and do not adhere to medical or ethical practice standards. Public health and medical organizations warn that CPCs pose risk to individual, family, and public health. <sup>[1]</sup>

**CPC Map is a geolocated directory of all of the crisis pregnancy centers operating in the United States.** CPC Map was developed and is maintained by researchers at the University of Georgia. CPC Map’s goals are to: (1) help individuals seeking health services know which centers are CPCs, (2) raise awareness about CPCs, and (3) facilitate evidence-based research related to CPCs. A center was categorized as a CPC if it: (a) provided services in a physical location, (b) offered at least free pregnancy tests, (c) was not primarily a maternity home or adoption agency.

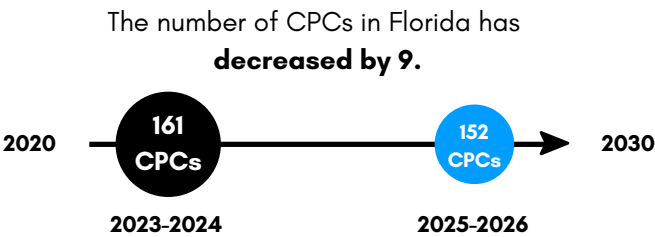
