However, CPCs Funded By The Georgia's CPC Grant Program Are Presenting Themselves As Clinics

CPCs are also known as: anti-abortion centers, fake clinics, and pregnancy resource centers. CPCs are religious non-profit organizations that aim to divert people from having abortions. They also oppose contraception and comprehensive sex education.

CPCs frequently provide inaccurate health information, and do not adhere to medical or ethical practice standards.

Public health and medical organizations warn that CPCs pose risk to individual, family, and public health.
