

CPC Map Data Use Request

Description of Data:

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The CPC Map Database is an online map and data resource. CPC Map aims to provide location and additional information about all crisis pregnancy centers operating in the United States. CPC Map data were generated from online research and phone calls. Data were initially collected in April-August 2018 (2018 dataset) and are updated periodically. National data updates were publicly released in December 2021 (2021 dataset) and January 2025 (2024 dataset).

Data Use Requests will be reviewed by the CPC Map Project Team on a case-by-case basis. CPC Map data may only be used for approved research and program planning purposes. Even after access is granted, additional analyses beyond the purpose for which access was originally granted require explicit approval by the CPC Team. No data that can lead to the identification of an individual center will be published or shared without explicit communication with the CPC Map team. Personal log-in information to the Database may not be shared with any party without approval of the CPC Map Project Team. Data are not to be downloaded and/or emailed without explicit stated approval to do so by the CPC Map team. Substantive changes to the project (e.g., inclusion of other collaborators who will have access to the data, changes in institutional affiliations, changes in the scope of the study) will require a new agreement.

In all dissemination materials (e.g., posters, presentations, manuscripts, fact sheets, brochures, press releases, etc.), the Database should be cited as:
